Wine Regions of Greece

NORTHERN GREECE

Northern Greece is mainly dedicated to the acclaimed Xinomavro, a grape variety that provides an awakening to the senses. With its wonderfully tannic structure these wines offer incredible complexity, depth and possibly the longest aging potential of any Greek red. The Naoussa and Amynteo regions exemplify the varietal, which greatly benefit from the cool climate and high elevation. Over to the east in Drama, the birthplace of theater, there are exciting whites made from Roditis and Assyrtiko. The diversity of terrains and climates in this region makes it one of the most exciting in all of Greece.



CENTRAL GREECE

Central Greece is a vast and important viticulture area, whose history was once focused on the mass production of wines. Most recently, it has experienced a winemaking renaissance. In the 1980s, newer vines were planted in the breathtaking Ritsona and foothills of Mt. Olympus, which has allowed the area to dedicate its land to quality wines. Due to the area's cooler climates and adequate varietal plantings, wines have gone from uninspiring to stunning. Rapsani, the prominent appellation of Central Greece, produces big, mouth-watering wines from Xinomavro, Stavroto and Krasato that will age beautifully in the cellar for years to come.



PELOPONNESE

The southernmost part of mainland Greece is home to the Peloponnese, an incredible area that despite its focus on white wines, still produces amongst the best reds in Greece. In the heart of the Peloponnese lies Mantinia, an appellation dedicated to the floral white Moschofilero and the neighboring Nemea where the luscious red Agiorgitiko is grown. Over in the seven mountainous Ionian Islands, Cephalonia reigns queen with its production of the elegant Robola.



CRETE

In the Southernmost point of Greece lays the island of Crete, which is home to 15 percent of the country's vineyards. Because of the island's close proximity to Africa, most of the region's viticulture is done in the cooler mountainous regions in the North to avoid heat and strong winds carrying sand.



AEGEAN ISLANDS

With its numerous islands, the Aegean Sea is home to many of Greece's most extraordinary terroirs, grape varietals and wines. The most unique from this region is found on the island of Santorini, where the insanely intense eruption of volcano Thera created the perfect ecosystem for the development of Assyrtiko wines. So harsh is the landscape that the vines must be grown in small pits known as stefani to protect the grapes from the wind and sun. The islands Lemnos, Paros and Rhodes are equally important, producing thrilling wines that will transport you to a warm sunset upon first sip!



WINES OF ISRAEL

Of five wine regions in Israel, Galilee is the northernmost region and produces the wines of the highest quality. Here wine is grown at altitudes as high as 3200 feet. Israel has a Mediterranean climate with hot and humid summer and cold rainy winters. In other words; everything needed to make great wines.



WINES OF LEBANON

Wine production in Lebanon is very small but has risen in the last few years. The Bekaa Valley in the Northeast of the country is the heart of wine production. Mainly French varietals are planted in Lebanon and they even began to apply wine laws, similar to France, to monitor and maintain quality of wine production.



WINES OF TURKEY

Winemaking has taken place in Turkey for thousands of years, with the use of both native and international varietals. Turkey has named over 1200 varieties that grow in their soils; however there are only about 30 of those varietals that are in large production. Turkey has a temperate Mediterranean climate with hot summers and mild winters. Most winemaking activities are focused around the Western coast where the country is bordered by three seas that help mitigate the warm climate. While there is great potential in the wines we have yet to see many of the best examples here.



Glossary

WHITE WINE GRAPES OF GREECE

Aidani – EYE-than-eh. Mainly used as a blending grape with Assyrtiko and Athiri. It's a little floral and a bit fruity. That it is used almost exclusively as a blending grape should tell you everything.

Assyrtiko – ah-SEER-tea-koh. Greece's most celebrated white grape varietal, Assyrtiko is mostly produced on the Island of Santorini where volcanic soils and the sea greatly influence aroma and flavor. It has crazy high acidity and often a bit of salty pluck. It's also pretty awesome as a rule.

Athiri – ah-THEER-ee. Fresh and fruity with lemon zest, moderate acidity and minerality. It's usually blended with Assyrtiko and the pair makes refreshing, easy wines.

Asproudes- ah-Sprow-days. Is actually plural for Asprouda, but there are many variations of Asprouda and they tend to be planted, harvested and vinified together. They usually make pretty light, fresh and vibrant young wines with lemony notes and show off a bit of minerality.

Katsano/Gaidouria – Always blended together, these two varietals make up less than 1% of wine production on the island of Santorini. Together they have floral notes, honeysuckle, and lemon blossom aromas.

Lagorthi – lah-GORE-thee. is a high acid white varietal that exhibits hints of white peach and fresh apples with hints of fresh basil and zippy citrus notes.

Malagousia -mah-lah-goo-zee-AAH. Malagousia is wildly aromatic with white flowers, citrus, and exotic fruits. The wines are full bodied with stunning silky texture. This varietal was almost extinct until Domaine Carras saved it in the 20th Century.

Malvasia – mahl-vah-ZEE-aah. Mainly used as a blending varietal where it provides aromas of pears and white flowers.

Moschofilero – MOH-skoh-FEE-leh-roh. Meaning "aromatic leaf" this pink skinned grape excites the senses with its intense floral notes; jasmine, violets, lilies, honeysuckle and rose.

Retsina – ret-SEE-nah. Retsina is a style of wine rather than a varietal. Roditis and Savatiano are the varieties most used in Retsina production. Traditionally, pine resin sealed the ceramic vessels used to store the wine. Today pine resin is intentionally added into the wine. Love it or hate it. There's no real in between.

Robola – ruh-BOH-lah. Grown mainly on the Ionian Island outside of Peloponnese, Robola produces aromatic fresh wines with delicate citrus and mineral aromas.

Roditis – roh-VEE-tees. A pink skinned variety, producing full bodied wines with melon and apple aromas. Roditis wines have a sour citrus freshness and moderate acidity.

Savatiano – sah-vah-tea-ah-NO. An aromatically intense varietal with high fruit character and broad structure; it is mostly used in the production of Retsina for better or worse.

WHITE WINE GRAPES OF LEBANON

Merwah – MARE-wha Rich, nutty and low in acid. Merwah adds weight and complexity to the wines of Chateau Musar. Jancis Robinson believes it may be related to Semillon and she's a smart lady, so I'd trust her.

Obaideh – oh-BAY-duh Believed by some to be the parent grape of Chardonnay brought to Europe by returning Crusaders. Likely untrue, but a cool story none the less.

WHITE WINE GRAPES OF TURKEY

Emir – EH-mehr. Translates to "ruler" and was so named for its popularity on the tables of great lords. It makes crisp refreshing whites.

Narince – nah-RIN-djeh. Translates to "delicate" or "fragile" this grape makes wines that are fresh and fruity with notes of orange, grapefruit, apple and lime.

RED WINE GRAPES OF GREECE

Agiorgitiko – ah-your-YEE-tea-koh. One of the most famous and important grapes in Greece. In Nemea they refer to it as the "blood of Hercules" as it is the wine Hercules supposedly got drunk enough on to fight and kill a lion. It has a wide array of styles; soft and silky, hard and tannic, mild, intense......Agiorgitiko (along with Xinomavro) is what I would probably encourage spending the most time exploring.

Kotsifali – koh-tsee-FAH-lee. Pretty much a vague blending grape with notes of strawberry, spices and herbs. It is mostly blended with Mandiliria to add color, acidity and tannins.

Krassato/Stavroto – krah-SAH-toh/Staf-RAH-toh These two varietals are equally blended with Xinomavro in the appellation of Rapsani. The trio is beautifully matched and produces wines that are deep ruby in color with aromas of sundried cherries olives and tomatoes with hints of vanilla and spice.

Limnio – leem-NYO. An ancient grape varietal first mentioned in Homer's writings; it produces wines that bursts with fresh herbs and berries with moderate tannins and relatively low acidity.

Mandilaria – mahn-dee-lahr-YA. Mostly seen in blends, it used to add color, tannins and alcohol to the wine.

Mavrodaphne – mahv-roh-DAHF-nee. Or "black laurel" this grape originated on the Ionian Islands outside of the Peloponnese. This grape is mostly used in the production of sweet fortified wines. In red wine production it showcases wild berries, cherries, dark spices and rustic earthiness with fierce tannins.

Mavrotragano – mah-vroh-trah-gah-NOH. As little as 10 years ago the entire production of this grape was made into sweet late harvest wines. Now a few exciting winemakers are showcasing the deeply colored dry wines with velvety tannins, high minerality, and beautiful herbal flavors.

Mavroudi - mahv-rudy. is a thick skinned and intense red grape grown throughout Greece. Famous as the wine brave Ulysses used to intoxicate the Cyclops so he and his men could escape the clutches of the giant it creates very dark and robust reds.

Moschomavro – MOH-skoh-maah-vroh. Light in body with violet aromas and delicate mouth feel.

Xinomavro – ksee-NOH-mahv-roh. Translating to "acid black," (which will be my next band name) this variety is known for its aging potential and complex aromas with hints of dark fruit, olive, and mint. Noted for its pale red color, high acidity, strong tannin structure and potential for long aging.

RED WINE GRAPES OF TURKEY

Boğazkere – Pronounced bow-AHHZ-keh-reh and translating to the super marketable phrase of "throat burner" it makes wines with dark fruits, moderate acidity and silly high levels of tannins. These are intense wines. It doesn't burn that bad. It's actually pretty tasty.

Kalecik Karasi – Prounounced KAH-le-djic Car-AH-sir and translated as "black from the small castle" because it is a black grape and comes from a town with a small castle. The flavors are more interesting than the translation with red cherry and raspberry, with a medium body and soft, fresh tannins.

Öküzgözü – Pronounced MOW-ter-hed and translated as "bullseye", this is the most planted red variety in Turkey in spite of being utterly impossible to pronounce. The wines are juicy, medium bodied, aromatic, with fresh acidity and soft tannins.
