If there were any cardinal rules in our “Meats and Potatoes” business, the phrase “Steak goes best with Cabernet” would probably be one of them. This may have been true when our founder, Alan Stillman opened Smith & Wollensky in the 1970’s. In this section named “Meat Market,” our Wine Director has hand-picked a short but diverse list of wines outside of the Cabernet domain.

AGLIANICO

Often described as Nebbiolo of the South, Aglianico was originally brought to Italy by Greek settlers in the time of Ancient Rome. With complex aromatics, sturdy and structure, and ability to age decades, these wines may be reminiscent of Barolo, but with an understated power that perfectly describes the climate of Southern Italy.
