(Zinfandel, Valdigue, Samsao) CA 2019

It really wasn't until the end of the 20th century that “pink wines” were enjoyed in America. A marketing milestone from Bob Trinchero of Sutter Home salvaged a stuck fermentation of his Zinfandel by releasing a paler, sweeter rosé colored wine that he labeled as “White Zinfandel”. Eventually becoming also known as “blush” styles of wine. It became and still is many people's understanding of pink wines. This wine however IS NOT THAT. Broc Cellars revamps California wines with more naturally made and farmed. Broc's Love Rosè taps into the spirit of European dry Mediterranean Rosé and shows off more pink pomelo than white zin's marshmallow.

Post WWII it was definitely more quantity than quality, which eventually even led to a radical evolution in the wine's style due to the influence of the “Super Tuscans”. Iconically Hannibal Lecter also spoke highly of these wines. This week we feature just that. A nice bottle of Chianti.
